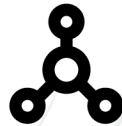
"I LOVE YOU ALL"

Home visits and parenting education opportunities focused on health and cultural connections, social engagement and cultural activities to support family and community connections utilizing Johns Hopkins University Family Spirit Home Visiting Curriculum.



OBJECTIVES

- Offer a minimum of eight educational or cultural opportunities to enrolled families per year.
- Have 90% of capacity enrollment in the Átawišamataš program by the EOY2.
- At minimum 75% of participants maintain enrollment and/or engagement for three years with the program.
- Program staff to ensure consistent monthly contact be made with 90% of expectant mothers up to 28 weeks.
- By the Y2 EOQ1 have SOPs and enrollment guidelines in place.
- Program staff will meet at minimum once a week with OB provider and CMA to ensure continuity of care for eligible participants.
- Establish at minimum bi-weekly collaboration within Yellowhawk departments.
- Communicate and collaborate with various community stakeholders at least once a month.
- By the EOY5 identify and implement cultural adaptations to the Átawišamataš program.
